For a graduated effect like the banister on the left, color pro Eve Ashcraft says to consult a paint-color wheel. "Find a section that appeals to you and keep to that order, which will make the shift feel natural," she says. DIY aficionado Natalie Cox of Nattybydesign.com applied similar logic when working with tonal shades in her pink desk below. "Selecting tints from the same swatch card ensures a compatible undertone," says Cox.
